## GRTC and City of Richmond Awarded \$750,000 For North/South Pulse Transit Oriented Development



**Richmond –** GRTC, in partnership with the City of Richmond, was awarded \$750,000 by the Federal Transit Administration as part of President Joe Biden's Infrastructure and Investment Act (IIJA) to plan for Transit-Oriented Development (TOD) on Chamberlayne Avenue in advance of GRTC's future North/South Pulse Bus Rapid Transit Line.

**GRTC Chief of Staff Adrienne Torres** celebrated the announcement, saying "Transit-oriented development has been a key feature of the existing Pulse Corridor, making it possible for thousands of new homes to access world-class rapid transit. This grant will allow the GRTC and the City to expand plans for more transit-oriented options along Chamberlayne Avenue, expanding the promise of the Pulse deeper into our communities."

**City of Richmond DPW Deputy Director Dironna Moore Clarke of the Office of Equitable Transit and Mobility states** "the North-South BRT project was a top recommendation from the newly approved Richmond Connects Plan. With the Award of FTA funds, GRTC and the City can now continue to make the North/South BRT a reality for Richmonders and the region."
